We are delighted that the author, former war correspondent and former independent politician Martin Bell OBE has agreed to be our speaker for this event.

As a war correspondent for the BBC Martin has covered some of the world's most difficult and dangerous news stories, including Vietnam, Angola, Northern Ireland and Bosnia where he was seriously wounded by shrapnel.

In 1997, he took the decision to stand as an independent MP for the constituency of Tatton a seat which had previously been held by Neil Hamilton who was at that time embroiled in 'sleaze' allegations.

As he stepped down in 2001 as a politician he was appointed UNICEF UK Ambassador for Humanitarian Emergencies a role he has embraced and in that capacity has travelled to many conflict areas including Sudan, Somalia, Afghanistan and the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

He will be talking about his fascinating life and his latest book *A Very British Revolution: The Expenses Scandal and How to Save Our Democracy*.

His journalism won him Royal Television Society Reporter of the Year Awards in 1977, 1992 and 1993.
